PRA=EXCESS

MEHA=URINE

Pratyatma lakshana :

- **Tatravilprabhutmutralakshanah Sarva eva Prameha**
(Sushruta, Nidan 6/6)
- **Samanyam lakshanam tesham prabhutavilmutrata**
Doshadushyavisheshepi tatsamyog visheshatah,
Mutravarnadibheden medo meheshu kalpate.
(Ashtanghridaya Nidan 10/7)
- In ayurvedic texts Prameha is defined to be characterized with excessive urination (both in frequency & quantity) and turbidity. The nature of the turbidity may vary depending upon the body reaction with the doshas.

CLASSIFICATION OF PRAMEHA

➤ **Etiological Classification (Sushrut)**

1. Sahaja Prameha (Growth onset/Juvenile/IDDM)

- Family history
- Early onset
- Asthenic constitution
- Prone to complications

2. Apathyanimittaja Prameha (NIDDM)

- Over nutrition
- Sedentary habits
- Obese
- Manageable with diet control and Herbo-mineral treatment (Apatarpana Chikitsa)

➤ Clinico-Pathological Classification

1. Kaphaja Prameha -10 (Early Diabetes)

- Overweight with Mild Hyperglycemia
- Polyuria/Glycosuria

2. Pittaja Prameha -6 (Acute Diabetes)

- Loss of weight
- Hyperglycemia and Glycosuria
- Urinary Tract Infection

3. Vataja Prameha -1 (Chronic Diabetes/Complications)

- Severe Hyperglycemia with Glycosuria
- Cachexia
- Nephropathy, Neuropathy
- Retinopathy
- Cardio Respiratory Complication
- Gangrene

➤ **Therapeutic classification based
on body constitution (Charak)**

1. Sthul Pramehi (Obese- NIDDM)

- Manageable with diet control and exercises

2. Krishna Pramehi (Asthenic- IDDM)

- Not manageable with diet control alone
- Rather requires nutritive treatment
(Brihmana chikitsa)

➤ Prognostic classification

1. Sadhya (Manageable)

- Apathyanimittaja Prameha (NIDDM)
- Kaphaja Prameha (Early Diabetes)
- Sthula Pramehi (Obese Diabetics)

2. Yanya (Palliative)

- Pittaja Prameha (Acute Diabetes)

3. Asadhyा (Unmanageable)

- Sahaja Prameha (IDDM)
- Vataja Prameha (Chronic Diabetes)
- Krishna Pramehi (Asthenic Diabetics)

TYPES OF PRAMEHA

❖ KAPHAJA: (10)

□ UDAKA MEHA -

- **Transparent**
- **Abundant**
- **White**
- **Cold**
- **Odourless**
- **Waterlike.**

TYPES OF PRAMEHA

□ IKSHUVALIKA:

- Excessively sweat,
- Cold,
- Slightly slimy,
- Turbid,
- Like the juice of Ikshuvalika.

TYPES OF PRAMEHA

- SANDRA MEHA-** when urine kept for the night precipitates in the pot.

- SANDRA PRASADA –** in this urine partly precipitates & is partly clear.

TYPES OF PRAMEHA

- PISTA MEHA – excretes urine frequently as white and flour like.**

- SUKRA MEHA – urine is mixed with semen.**

TYPES OF PRAMEHA

- **SITA MEHA** – frequent and excessive urination, urine is sweet and cold.

- **SIKATA MEHA** – one who passes small particles situated morbidity in urine.

TYPES OF PRAMEHA

- SANAIR MEHA – passes urine with difficulty and slowly without any urge.**

- LALA MEHA – urine as bound with threads. Saliva like, slimy.**

TYPES OF PRAMEHA

❖ **PITTAJA – 6 TYPES.**

- 1.Kasarameha – urine like alkali in respect of smell, color, taste & touch.**
- 2.Kalameha – urine is hot & of black of colour.**
- 3.Nilameha – urine is having sour taste, having colour like that of the feather of casa bird.**

TYPES OF PRAMEHA

PITTAJA – 6 TYPES.

- 4. Rakta meha – urine has fleshy smell, saline taste, hot & red in colour.**
- 5. Manjista meha – urine resembles the decoction of manjista & having fleshy smell.**
- 6. Haridra meha – urine like decoction of haridra has pungent taste.**

TYPES OF PRAMEHA

❖ VATAJA – 4 TYPES (incurable)

- 1. Vasa meha – urine mixed with muscle fat.**
- 2. Majja meha – passes majja along with urine.**
- 3. Hasti meha – passes urine excessively and constantly like an excited elephant.**
- 4. Madhu meha – passes urine as astringent , sweat pale, rough.**
